






STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS






DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE




ACADEMIC PROGRESS

IN-YEAR GROWTH IN READING & MATH % Students that Met or Exceeded Target Growth Goals



St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
